

Restriction on the use of certain Hazardous Substances
in products made by Lackwerke PETERS

To whom it may concern

Various directives of the European Union restrict and/or prohibit the use of certain substances in electronic/electrical devices:

*RoHS directive 2011/65/EU (**RoHS** = **R**estriction of the use **o**f certain **H**azardous **S**ubstances in electrical and electronic equipment)*

The directive specifies the following substances and their compounds as hazardous: lead, mercury, cadmium, hexavalent chromium, polybrominated biphenyls (PBB) and/or polybrominated diphenylethers (PBDE, including Decabromo diphenylether (DecaBDE)). Lackwerke PETERS does not use any exemptions for its products.

ELV directive 2000/53/EC

The heavy metals mentioned in the vehicle end-of life directive 2000/53/EC (**ELV** = **E**nd of **l**ife **v**ehicles) are part of the substances mentioned in the RoHS directive.


*WEEE directive 2002/96/EC (**WEEE** = **W**aste from **E**lectric and **E**lectronic **E**quipment)*

The directive on electric and electronic equipment restricts the use of certain substances which complicate a recycling.

Restriction of substances according *Annex XVII „Restrictions on the manufacture, placing on the market and use of certain dangerous substances, mixtures and articles“ of REACH-Ordinance 1907/2006/EC as successor of Directive 76/769/EEC including directive 2003/11/EC – Use of brominated flame retardants* (Specified are pentabrominated diphenylether or octabrominated diphenylether) and directive 2006/122/EC (specified are perfluorooctane sulfonates (PFOS) and Perfluorooctanoic acid (PFOA)).

Our products fulfil the requirements of the mentioned regulations.
